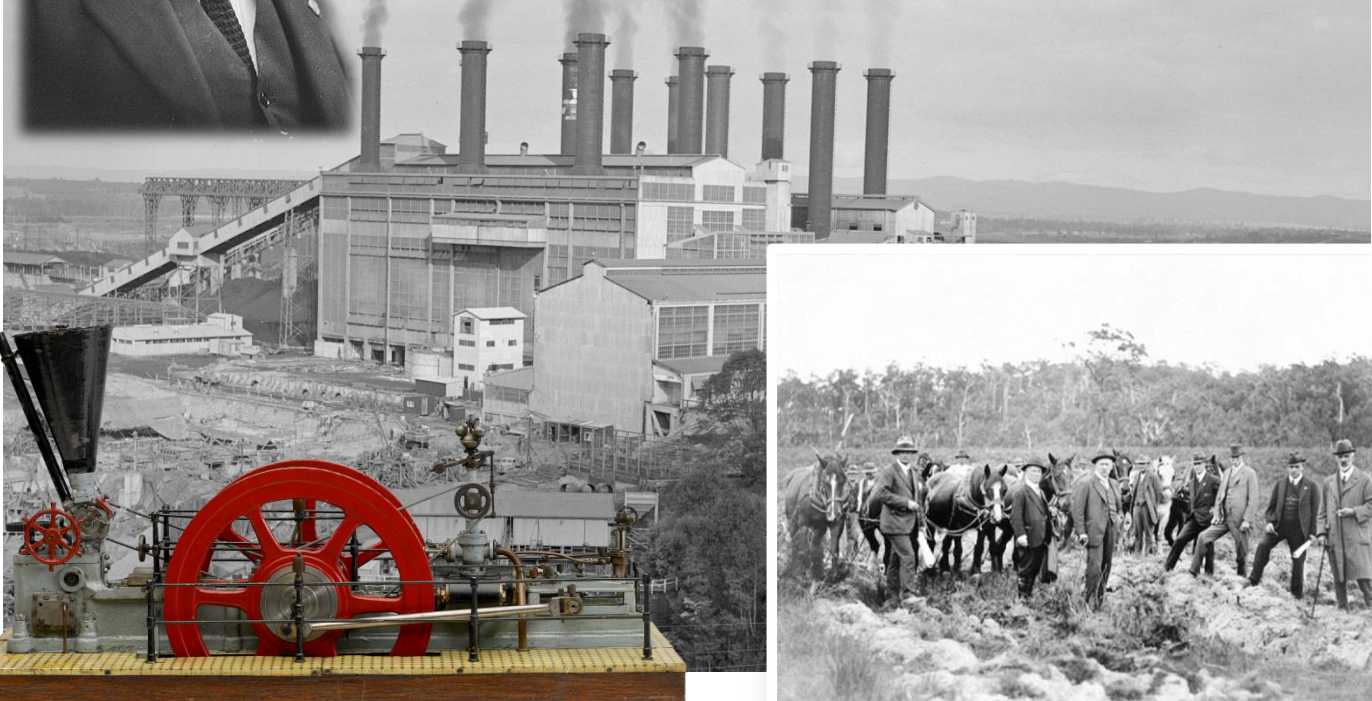

Sir John Monash (1865-1931) is widely recognised as one of the best allied commanders of WWI and a brilliant military strategist and organiser. Less well known is his subsequent role steering the State Electricity Commission of Victoria through its tumultuous first decade from 1921-1931. Battling technical challenges, ferocious press attacks, political opposition, Royal Commissions and public scepticism, he successfully established brown coal mining and power generation in the Latrobe Valley, securing Victoria’s energy future for the next century.

Bernard Mulholland served as an Australian Army Reservist for 25 years and had the honour of commanding the Melbourne University Regiment, of which Monash was the first Honorary Colonel. During this period, he developed a keen interest in the life and accomplishments of Sir John Monash.
