CONFERENCE ORGANISATION

Presentations & Abstracts

While the Conference theme is “In the Footsteps of John Moffat”, any papers relevant to Mining History will be welcome. Individual oral presenters other than keynote speakers will be allocated 20 minutes with an additional 5 minutes for questions. Strict timing will be adhered to. Presentations should be saved on disk or memory stick, and handed to one of the organizers well before the scheduled session.

There will also be the opportunity for poster presentations and time during tea breaks for presenters to talk to their posters. Posters should be designed to fit an area of ca. 0.9x1.2m. Poster boards will be provided.

ABSTRACTS

For those who wish to make either oral or poster presentations, abstracts should be submitted using the **Abstract Template** on the Website at: <http://www.mininghistory.asn.au/next-conference/> Conference experience has proven this approach to ensure uniformity and professional presentations. It is the author's responsibility to ensure that the abstract is correct in all details. GETTING TO Atherton

Note: Rental cars are available in Cairns. **Cairns Airport** is only an hour's drive from Atherton. The town is also served by a bus service from Cairns – see:

On 6th July we will use a mini bus to carry people from Cairns Airport to Atherton (one morning & one afternoon shuttle, timing depends on demand) and back to Cairns on the evening of the 14th, though if on the Chillagoe tour, you might wish to be taken back to Cairns by the tour coach.

ACCOMMODATION – BOOK EARLY

In Atherton and surrounding areas options are available, from campgrounds to motels to hotels and B&B's. In Chillagoe options are more limited and you are urged to book early. Participants are responsible for booking their own accommodation: see conference website for details of accommodation for both Atherton and Chillagoe.

CLIMATE AND DRESS

During early July in Atherton, mean daily temperatures range from 22°C and overnight around 12°C. Field trip areas will be warmer (24 to 28°C). Dress code for the conference is casual, ranging to smart casual for the reception and conference dinner. Field trips call for sturdy, closed footwear, sunscreen and hats. Carry water on tours. If you have them, bring along binoculars.

CONFERENCE VENUE

AROUND Atherton

The Atherton Tablelands was once dense rainforest and some of this has been preserved around local beauty spots within a short driving distance of Atherton: the Curtain and Cathedral Fig Trees, volcanic lakes Eacham and Barrine, the Waterfall Circuit at Millaa Millaa, The Crater.
